I. Definition

Definition

"Professional Ethics are moral principles of conduct guiding professionals. Codes of professional ethics are established by the organisation and professionals. A violation of professional ethics will make the professional subject to disciplinary action"

II. Purpose of Code of Professional Ethics

- Promote safe and effective practice
- Encourage trust between professionals and service users
- Inform about the professionals' ethical obligations towards service users
- Ensure protection of service users
- Explicitly state what to expect from the professional practitioner

III. Professional Code Doctor

- Absolute respect of human rights and dignity towards all people regardless of gender, race, disabilities e.t.c.
- Treatment of people with respect and dignity
- May not refuse services for any reason which is not relate to scientific competency
- If the patient does not have the capacity to consent to treatment third parties have to be informed and give consent (parents', guardians e.t.c.)
- Special attention when providing care to vulnerable groups

IV. Professional Code Child Psychiatrist

- Every child and their family should be treated with respect irrespective of disability, sex, social status e.t.c.
- Primary concern is the mental well being and development of the child
- Duty to cooperate with parents to improve their parenting skills
- Adherence to the principle of confidentiality
- Inform the child and their parents about any intervention and its benefits and risks

V. Professional Code Child Psychologist

- Provide to all patients the same care regardless of disability, religion ideology and socio-economic situation
- Promote feeling of professional freedom and wellbeing
- Frequency of visits of the patient and parents/guardians should be based on the gravity of the case
- Maintain confidentiality

VI. Professional Code Social Worker

- Must not discriminate based on disability, sex, race e.t.c.
- Promote clients' sense of personal freedom and free will
- Respect privacy and confidentiality of any information revealed by clients.

VII. Professional Code Special Teacher

- Must not discriminate against people with disabilities on the basis of the severity of the disability and financial and social status
- Must not subject the child and the family to unnecessary and expensive treatment
- Must take appropriate steps to integrate children with special educational needs in all schools in the country
- Should always apply methods to modify behaviour which does not affect dignity and basic Human Rights
- Must seek ways to build relationships with the parents and work together towards integrating the child into the school environment
- Should respect confidentiality

VIII. What to expect

- Understanding on the part of the professionals
- The cultivation of conditions for close and constructive cooperation
- Focus on your child
- Cooperation regarding therapeutic, educational and rehabilitation procedures
- Support and education for you to be able provide proper care for your child
- Information and proper explanation of the diagnosis
- Cooperation between professionals

VIIII.SUMMARY

- •Professional ethics is a Code of Conduct which guides professionals
- •Professionals that follow the Codes of Ethics should be competent, with the appropriate Qualifications and should always respect Confidentiality

- •The family should always be involved in the therapeutic plan
